Environmental hazard	Very toxic to aquatic organisms.	
Primary route of exposure	Route of exposure is inhalation and skin and eye contact.	
Symptoms relating to use	Product and spray is poisonous if absorbed by skin contact or inhaled or swallowed. Repeated minor exposure may have a cumulative poisoning effect.

General Information:	<p>If poisoning occurs, for advice, contact the National Poisons Centre on 0800 POISON (0800 764766) or a doctor immediately. Atropine tablets 0.6mg should be available in the area where this product is used, or in a nearby unlocked medicine cabinet.</p> <p>If swallowed, give one atropine tablet every 5 minutes until dryness of the mouth occurs - if poisoned by skin absorption or through lungs, remove any contaminated clothing, wash skin thoroughly and give atropine tablets as above. Get to a doctor or hospital quickly.</p>
Skin contact:	<p>If this product comes into contact with skin, wash skin for at least 15 minutes with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing and footwear. Ensure contaminated clothing is thoroughly washed before using again. See above if poisoning occurs.</p>
Eye contact:	<p>If this product comes into contact with eyes, hold open and wash with running water for at least 15 minutes. Ensure irrigation under eyelids by occasionally lifting them. Do not try to remove contact lenses unless trained.</p>
Ingestion:	<p>If swallowed, or if any of the above symptoms occur, <b>call a doctor immediately</b>. If symptoms of poisoning are occurring give one atropine tablet every ¼ hour until the pupils enlarge, or use an automatic injection device according to instructions. <b>Take to hospital without delay.</b></p>
Inhalation:	<p>If mists, dusts or combustion products are inhaled, remove to fresh air. Lay victim down &amp; keep warm and rested. If breathing is shallow, or has stopped, ensure clear airway and apply resuscitation or oxygen if available. Transport to hospital or doctor immediately. See above if poisoning occurs.</p> <p>Eye wash baths and deluge showers should be available where this product is being used.</p>
Note to Physician:	Treat symptomatically. Note the nature of this product.
<b>5) Fire-Fighting Measures:</b>	
Flammable Class	This product is not flammable.
Extinguishing media	Carbon dioxide, dry chemical, foam, water fog.
Special exposure hazards	Wear full protective clothing including self contained breathing apparatus.
Unusual fire & Explosion hazards	Decomposition products are toxic and corrosive. There is little risk of an explosion from this product if involved in a fire.

## 6) Accidental Release Measures:

Spills and disposals:	In event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses. Call Fire Brigade or emergency services. Wear full protective clothing including self contained breathing apparatus. Stop leak if safe to do so, and contain spill. Absorb onto vermiculite or other absorbent material. Sweep up and shovel or collect recoverable product into labelled containers for recycling or salvage. After spills, wash area, preventing runoff from entering drains. If material enters drains, advise emergency services. This material may be suitable for approved landfill. Dispose of only in compliance with local, state and federal regulations. Launder all contaminated clothing before reuse.
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


## 7) Handling & Storage:

General	Keep out of reach of children. Keep away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs. If you feel unwell, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre immediately (show the label where possible).
Engineering Controls	In industrial situations, concentration values below the TWA value should be maintained. Values may be reduced by process modification, use of local exhaust ventilation, capturing substances at the source, or other methods. If you believe air borne concentrations of mists, dusts or vapours are high, you are advised to modify the process or environment to reduce the problem.
Storage and transport	This product is classed as UN3018, Dangerous Goods Class 6.1 Toxic Substances. Proper Shipping name is: ORGANOPHOSPHORUS PESTICIDE, LIQUID, TOXIC. Class 6 Toxic Substances shall not be loaded in the same vehicle or packed in the same freight container with Classes 1 (Explosives), 3 (Flammable Liquids where the Flammable Liquid is nitromethane), 5.1 (Oxidising Agents where the Toxic Substances are Fire Risk Substances), 5.2 (Organic Peroxides where the Toxic Substances are Fire Risk Substances), 8 (Corrosive Substances where the Toxic Substances are cyanides and the Corrosives are acids), Foodstuffs and foodstuff empties. They may however be loaded in the same vehicle or packed in the same freight container with Classes, 2.1 (Flammable Gases), 2.2 (Non-Flammable, Non-Toxic Gases), 2.3 (Toxic Gases), 3 (Flammable liquids, except where the flammable liquid is nitromethane), 4.1 (Flammable Solids), 4.2 (Spontaneously Combustible Substances), 4.3 (Dangerous When Wet Substances), 5.1 (Oxidising Agents except where the Toxic Substances are Fire Risk Substances), 5.2 (Organic Peroxides except where the Toxic Substances are Fire Risk Substances), 7 (Radioactive Substances), 8 (Corrosive Substances except where the Toxic Substances are cyanides and the Corrosives are acids), 9 (Miscellaneous Dangerous Goods) Containers should be kept closed in order to minimise contamination. Keep from extreme heat and open flames, and make sure the material does not come into contact with water or acids.

Persons must be excluded from the start of the application until a minimum of 2 hours after the end of the application.</p>

<b>Exposure</b>	<p>May be harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. May cause eye and mild skin irritation. Suspected carcinogen. May cause neurological symptoms (See 'Symptoms of Poisoning' below) from repeated ingestion at high doses. Very toxic to aquatic organisms, terrestrial vertebrates and terrestrial invertebrates.</p>
<b>PERSONAL PROTECTIVE (PPE) AND RESPIRATORY PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (RPE):</b>	<p>Avoid contact with eyes and skin. Avoid inhalation of vapour or spray mist. When mixing or applying, wear chemical resistant overalls, chemical resistant boots and gloves, chemical resistant footwear plus socks, chemical resistant head gear, eye protection and respirator (organic vapour and particulate matter). Clean protective clothing daily after work. Do not eat, drink or smoke while using. Remove protective clothing and wash hands and face thoroughly before meals and after work. <b>SPRAY DRIFT:</b>	<p>The person applying the substance must not cause adverse effects beyond the boundary of the treated property, and must also avoid adverse effects from spray drift occurring. Mitigation measures employed must be recorded as part of the application records.</p>
